- Study Update -

The Engage Study has **recently changed its eligibility criteria** to include people who have initiated treatment within the **last year** rather than the last 6 months. This will provide us with more opportunities to contact people, give people more time to participate, and, we hope, increase our study enrolment.

Since kicking off recruitment in December, 2013, we have enrolled 57 participants from across BC in this study. We will be recruiting participants until December, 2015.


We are beginning work to disseminate our preliminary results. For example, we recently submitted two abstracts to the 2015 Canadian Conference on HIV/AIDS Research (one on our preliminary study results and one on our recruitment methods). Future presentations and posters will be uploaded to the


Engage website.

Study Components

Participants complete a 1-hour initial survey and follow-up survey 6 to 12 months later. The survey can be done in-person at St. Paul's Hospital in Vancouver or over the phone using our toll-free number (1-855-506-8615). Participants receive their choice of a \$50 honorarium or entries into a draw for an iPad for each survey.

If you know anyone who may be eligible please pass along our study information. To be eligible, as person needs to be:

- Over the age of 19,
- Diagnosed HIV positive,

- Started taking HAART for the first time within the past year (their first prescription ever, not restarting treatment).
