
OVERVIEW OF THE SHAPE STUDY

- The STOP HIV/AIDS Program Evaluation (SHAPE) study 2.0 is a province-wide cohort study of people living with HIV (PLWH) across BC, that assesses the changing landscape of HIV services, aging, mental health, substance use, and chronic comorbidities that uniquely impact PLWH in British Columbia. The SHAPE 2.0 survey was launched in August 2024 and is open for eligible people living with HIV across the province until August 2026 (in-person, over the phone or online).
- As of January 2026, a total of 1091 participants have completed the survey.

FIRST ANALYSIS OF SHAPE 2.0

We examined the health priorities of these 1091 SHAPE 2.0 participants who completed the survey. These findings are part of an abstract that is submitted to the 35th Canadian Conference on HIV/AIDS Research (CAHR 2026) and will be reported in a manuscript in the near future.


Demographic characteristics of SHAPE 2.0 Participants (as of January 2026)
